

Ried GRUB | 1 DAC Erste Lage | Kamptal DAC

ORIGIN: Ried (single vineyard, cru) Grub literally meaning "pit" is a basin between the mountains Heiligenstein and Gaisberg, which is slightly higher than other vineyards planted with Grüner Veltliner. Protected from wind on three sides it opens to the south. The soil consists of a thick layer of pure loess underneath which remains of bones from the Stone Age are found.

CHARACTER: Ried Grub wines show an elusive interplay between the warm (ripe seed fruit and rich extract) and cool (herbal) aromas., destined to be married with a variety of food, notably cheese dishes and levantine cuisine combining spices and fruit. Expect very good cellaring potential.

WINELIST-DESCRIPTION: Austrias oldest musical instrument - a bone flute over 20.000 years old - was found in Ried GRUB. Wines from these soils marry richness and elegant acidity. They release pomaceous notes and a herbal quality and offer good concentration as well as a bright, lively finish with layered complexity and tension.
