

Ried GAISBERG | 1^{ÖTW} Erste Lage | Kamptal DAC

ORIGIN: Ried (single vineyard, cru) Gaisberg belongs to three villages (Kammern, Zöbing and Strass) and is situated just east of Heiligenstein. Geologically, this most eastern part of the Gföhler gneiss plate is marked by slaty para-gneiss, amphibolite and mica. Some parts of the Riesling terraces contain the oldest vineyards of the estate.

CHARACTER: Ried Gaisberg delivers wines with bright light golden colour and very clear, refined aromatics on the complex and exciting nose. Highly fine, fresh and elegant on the palate, which is as balanced as it is dense and tensioned. Salivating with stony and salty notes on the finish, long and lingering, classic and stylish with great purity and ageing potential. Naturally this will be a great match for fine fish dishes and smoked meats but also compliments California cuisine and the euro-asian fusion kitchen.

WINELIST-DESCRIPTION: Gaisbergs primary rock delivers a picture-book Kamptal Riesling: Precise, generous, intense and fleshy but also highly fine structured and elegantly cool. Parts of the Gaisberg terraces belong to the oldest vineyards of the winery.

SCHLOSS GOBELSBURG, a Cistercian monastic estate, is one of the oldest wineries in the Austrian Danube area with a documented history that dates back to 1171. All the vineyards are located on slopes and terraces around the valley of the river Kamp near the town of Langenlois and the village of Gobelsburg. Schloss Gobelsburg specialises in Grüner Veltliner and Riesling and produces authentic and noble wines from different single vineyard, village and regional appellations. The winery is member of the association 'Österreichische Traditionsweingüter', which is working on a vineyard classification project for the Danube area.
